17. General Discussion

Capital Project – A discussion was held by the Board and members of the community concerning the proposed Capital Bond. It was decided that Board would call a special meeting (vote) on December 9, 2014. They proposed that the project would be separated into two propositions, separating the turf field proposal from the rest. The Board adopted the following resolution:

Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, and on motion by Mr. Unger and carried 5-0, the Board of Education voted to approve the following resolution:

RESOLUTION OF THE CENTER MORICHES UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT, NEW YORK, ADOPTED OCTOBER 16, 2014, CALLING A SPECIAL DISTRICT MEETING TO AUTHORIZE THE EXPENDITURE OF MONEYS FOR SCHOOL PURPOSES AND THE LEVY OF A TAX THEREFOR.

RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE CENTER MORICHES UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT, IN THE COUNTY OF SUFFOLK, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A Special District Meeting of the qualified voters of the Center Moriches Union Free School District, in the County of Suffolk, New York (the "District"), shall be held within the District, on Tuesday, December 9, 2014, at 7:00 o'clock A.M. (Prevailing Time) in the Clayton Huey Elementary School, 511 Main Street, Center Moriches, New York, as provided in the Notice calling said Special District Meeting hereinafter substantially prescribed. The voting at such Special District Meeting shall be by voting machine, as provided by the Education Law, and the polls shall remain open from 7:00 o'clock A.M. to 9:00 o'clock P.M. (Prevailing Time) on said day and as much longer as may be necessary to enable the voters, then present, to cast their votes.

Section 2. The business to be acted upon at said Special District Meeting shall be as stated in the Notice thereof, and the District Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause the Notice of said Special District Meeting to be published in "Long Island Advance" and "The Long Island Business News," two newspapers each having a general circulation within the District, such publications to be at least made four (4) times within the seven (7) weeks next preceding such Special District Meeting, the first publications to be at least forty-five (45) days prior to the date of said Special District Meeting.

Section 3. Said Notice of Special District Meeting shall be in substantially the following form:

BOND PROPOSITION #1

RESOLVED:

- (a) That the Board of Education of the Center Moriches Union Free School District, in the County of Suffolk, New York (the "District"), is hereby authorized to construct additions, alterations and improvements to all District school buildings and the sites thereof (the "Project"), substantially as described in the report entitled "Facilities Evaluation - 2014", dated October 9, 2014, prepared for the District by John A. Grillo, Architects, (the "Report"), which report is on file and available for public inspection at the office of the District Clerk; such Project consisting of (as and where required): the construction of building additions and interior reconstruction and space reconfiguration to provide for additional instructional and other space; roof reconstruction and/or replacement; improvements to lavatories and to the heating, ventilation, air conditioning, electrical, lighting, mechanical, septic, plumbing, fire alarm, clock, and public address systems; window, door, ceiling, and floor replacements; exterior building envelope and driveway enhancements; reconstruction of tennis and basketball courts; and track improvements; all of the foregoing to include the original furnishings, equipment, machinery, apparatus and ancillary or related site, demolition and other work required in connection therewith; and to expend therefor, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, an amount not to exceed the estimated total cost of \$18,850,000; provided that the detailed costs of the components of the Project as set in detail in the Report may be reallocated among such components if the Board of Education shall determine that such reallocation is in the best interests of the District;
- (b) that a tax is hereby voted in the aggregate amount of not to exceed \$18,850,000 to finance said cost, such tax to be levied and collected in installments in such years and in such amounts as may be determined by said Board of Education; and
- (c) that in anticipation of said tax, bonds of the District are hereby authorized to be issued in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$18,850,000 and a tax is hereby voted to pay the interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable.

BOND PROPOSITION #2

RESOLVED:

- (a) THAT IN THE EVENT BOND PROPOSITION NO. 1 IS APPROVED, the Board of Education of the Center Moriches Union Free School District, in the County of Suffolk, New York (the "District"), is hereby authorized to construct a new turf field at the Secondary Campus, at the estimated cost of not to exceed \$1,050,000; the foregoing to include the original furnishings, equipment, machinery, apparatus and ancillary or related site, demolition and other work required in connection therewith; and to expend therefor, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, an amount not to exceed the estimated total cost of \$1,050,000;
- (b) that a tax is hereby voted in the aggregate amount of not to exceed \$1,050,000 to finance said cost, such tax to be levied and collected in installments in such years and in such amounts as may be determined by said Board of Education;
- (c) that in anticipation of said tax, bonds of the District are hereby authorized to be issued in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$1,050,000 and a tax is hereby voted to pay the interest on said bonds as the same shall become due and payable; and
- (d) that if this Bond Proposition No. 2 is approved, it shall become effective only in the event that Bond Proposition No. 1 is approved.
