President Foster called the meeting to order at 7:30 with the Pledge of Allegiance. There were 60 visitors present.

Superintendent's Report

- Honorable Mention New York State Letters about Literature Contest Ms. Foster, Ms. Bates presented Jesse DiMatteo with a certificate to recognize Jesse for receiving honorable mention in the NYS Letters about Literature Contest.
- 2015-2016 Budget Adoption Presentation Mr. Stewart, Ms. Perkins The Superintendent of Schools Russell Stewart and Business Official Carol Perkins reviewed the financial and instructional components of the 2015-2016 budget. In order to close the gap between the projected 2015-16 revenue and expenses \$206605), the Superintendent is recommending reducing the District Office clerical staff, reducing the paraprofessional staff and elimination of the Parent Child Home Program.
- Closing the Academic Gap: Improving School Readiness Ms. Hardwick and Mr. Soto presented possible ways to the make up for the loss of the PCHP program and ease the transition of students into Kindergarten, including revamping the structure of the Future Educators Club (to interact directly with students in the PCHP program), applying for grants to possibly continue the program, and reaching out to the Community Center for assistance in preparing students to enter Kindergarten.

2015-2016 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

State Environment Quality Review Notice of Determination of Non-Significance

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Center Moriches Union Free School District is the lead agency under the State Environmental Quality Review Process for the purpose of required determinations respecting the proposed Capital Improvement Projects as follows:

Center Moriches High School Gymnasium - Structural Repairs

WHEREAS, in 1995, amendments were made to the SEQRA Regulation (Part 617) to classify projects, which will be excluded from the requirements for the preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement (Type II Actions). The projects mentioned above are now classified as Type II Actions as determined by 6NYCRR§617.5 and WHEREAS, these projects fall under the following categories:

- A. Routine Maintenance and Repair 6NYCRR§617.5 (c)(1): Maintenance or repair involving no substantial change in an existing facility.
- B. Replace or Rehabilitation 6NYCRR§617.5 (c)(2): Replacement or rehabilitation or reconstruction of a structure or facility, in kind, on the same site, unless the work exceeds a threshold for a Type I action in 6NYCRR§617.4.

THEREFORE, as the lead agency for the SEQRA determination, all the above referenced projects fall under Categories "A" or "B" above. The procedure for Type II Actions, with regard to the SEQRA Process for Capital Projects noted above is "No Additional Required Action under 6NYCRR§617.5(a)".
